"And Something to ponder on" from Dian Harrison

I was stopped me in my tracks during the singing of a hymn I didn't know, in church on Sunday.
It was by Frederick Faber, and my thought to ponder on is:

"There is no place where earth's sorrows are
more felt than up in heav'n"

Ultreya – St Mary's East Leake – Sat 25th Apr 2026

My Name is John, a believer, a follower of Christ, a cursillista and one who first experienced Cursillo some 42 years ago when commencing my reader training back in 1984.

Now I don’t know about how you came to make your decision to attend Cursillo, whether you were excited, just plain curious about it or like me reluctant even to the point of being resistant about it.

I confess, initially I wasn’t keen, I didn’t think it was for me. I was already aware, or so I thought that I knew about God’s love for me. Eventually I let go and said yes for that Cursillo changing experience to also work in me.

My weekend was truly life changing, it stripped me of my human arrogance of what I thought I knew so well about my faith, as it did my preconceived ideas of what God’s love was about. That weekend, I learnt something that to this day I still carry in my heart and mind. Truths from God, some which were revealed to me over that weekend and some given later in my journey of faith when God knew I was ready to receive them.

You see whilst God does indeed give us free choice to choose or refuse him, having chosen to follow him, he does not give us freedom or license to use his name to submit others to our will; for our God is a God of freedom and love, not control. We are not given permission to make him fit into our way of thinking of who he is, or us believing we can know all of what he is capable of. Our loving God is so much more than our minds can contemplate or understand. Our God knows our frailties, that it takes time for us to fully grasp the magnitude of God’s love for us. Which is why he only gives us what we need at the time we need it, something I have come to learn over many years.

During my life, I have been inspired by many things, I’ve seen God at work in many parts of the world. Yet, attending my first Cursillo, living the experience in the fullness of God’s love, love offered in abundance to me is something that will remain with me all my life. Relived through the sharing of that joy in the years that followed, in the many subsequent Cursillos I later staffed on. These were heady days for me and all those who were called to those early Cursillos, indeed for the whole of the Southwell Diocese. As the word about Cursillo got passed on it brought candidates from all corners of the Diocese queuing up for inclusion in the 3 weekends a year we ran then. In our early years, the numbers attending approached and often exceeded some 30 per weekend. Launde was often full to bursting as one weekend experience begat another, as those returning from it spoke to their churches of all that they had received and were eager to pass it on.

Here in St Mary’s we were no different, indeed as I reflect on it the Holy Spirit working thro’ Cursillo meant that in no time at all we had had some 40 cursillistas in our regular congregation of just over 100, all of which, living in the Holy spirit, fed a strong revival movement within our Church.

Our worship then was filled with dancing, drama, moving testimonies from young and old alike, fellowship groups sprung up and relationships were formed that last to this day and our Church was united and alive and above all joyful. It grew strong in faith, the spirit leading us to reach out as we were invited lead worship in other Churches across Nottingham, bringing many people to Christ for the first time even leading in a number of them going on to ordination.

I have also learnt in my journey of faith, those Cursillo inspired mountain top experiences don’t last forever, indeed, my life in the years that followed, seems to be forever looking up and wondering however did I ever scale those heights and how do I get back to them. Perhaps for some of you here today, you too share this thought, and it strikes a chord in you.

Which is why I want to encourage you as to why we who have experienced the wonder of God’s grace and love through the eyes of Cursillo, should always be ready to share our faith with everyone we meet. Ready for action, and expect to see God working great things in our lives and of those around us.

I said earlier, that on my first cursillo weekend I learnt about the depth of God’s love for me, what I didn’t know at the time but have learnt over the many years that have followed I have

come to know that God gave me many other promises, one of which I share with you now, which is his message of love for us all, remains as young and fresh as it ever was and Cursillo as part of God's plan for his people will adapt and evolve to become what is needed and required to be. Whenever I forget this truth, I am reminded to reflect on the reading from Luke's Gospel we heard read. What I have come to realize over the years, just what is contained in this scripture, for it speaks to me about faith and what can be achieved for those who accept it and live by it. Verses reminding us of our human nature, which tells me that, however much I might try to fashion my outward appearances, inwardly, perhaps there are times when I'm too much like the Pharisee, Simon, for comfort.

You see, If I'm really honest with myself, and more importantly, honest to God, this is something I know already. I know that in my heart there are dark recesses where my base nature lives unseen and unknown by anyone but myself and God. Yet Luke's great message in those verses today takes account of that and is not one of condemnation, but one of Hope. It's, this that inspires me to accept my failings; God's message of love covers me when I surrender myself to God's mercy.

When I consider the unknown woman in Luke's story, often I see myself in it. Whenever, because of my human frailties life becomes difficult, I remind myself that like this woman, the only person left, who will lift me out of my doubts and despair and give me back my life is our Lord and Saviour, Jesus. I know that I will never be rejected by our loving father, if I will but call upon him.

I invite you all to take that thought in, just pause for a moment to drink in all of the sweetness of that promise, what it means for you as it does me, that even with our warts and all, we can be certain that God will keep his promises of a life in him, filled not with despair but with hope.

I am all too aware of how easily it can be for the light which shone brightly in me, perhaps you too when first we came to the Lord and again when experiencing Cursillo can sometimes without us even realizing, become dimmed.

In that dimming, follows fearfulness, we become tired and hesitant of our faith, especially when speaking with non-believers. We can allow the problems of the world and our everyday life to drag us down so that the joy and light of our faith is all but extinguished - leaving nothing for others to see.

If this sounds like you and you find yourself in a dark place, and your flame of faith is guttering, like I did when my beloved wife Chris was called home on the 17th June 2023 into God's heaven, MANY DARK AND DESPARATE DAYS and months FOLLOWED AS I CLUNG in sorrow TO MY FAITH both in the scriptures and IN OUR LOVING FATHER God, may I suggest you read again this passage from Luke's gospel, for this story, dare I suggest is not only my story, perhaps it's your story too, if so come and share God's love in his redemption and forgiveness with me.

I truly believe that God wants us to show his redeeming love to everyone we meet, for this is what will draw others to him. Not just by our good deeds important though they are, but in our retelling of what he has done for us and continues to do for us; with conviction in our voices and with joyful optimism.

I am convinced that this is how God will continue to use Cursillo, as in him, he will use you and I to revive one another and in doing so, our churches and send out the message that in Jesus Christ all are called. Even now in old age, my Christian calling remains as strong as ever, like witnessing to my choir friends, my swimming friends or people I just meet I have found that God still uses me in all situations, my body may fail me now and it does, but my God never does.

So this is why through my long journey as a cursillista, I still feel so excited and optimistic for the future in our Christian faith, I pray you feel it too, for there is much work to be done! Ultreya!



SA's Response – Michelle Greenberry

Thank you John for a lovely witness talk –

We can see that you have been richly blessed By God through Cursillo, And in turn, you are a rich Blessing to others you meet and interact with.

First. Wow! 1984! 42 years a Cursillista, way to go! Congratulations.

At the beginning of your talk. I was reminded of the phrase 'Let go and let God'. Life is so much more enjoyable and richer when you do this. It is what God wants for us, His children.

Now, I don't often use lots of Bible quotes, when I'm giving a talk, because normally the Bible has been read and I am explaining what I've learned about it. But as I read John's witness talk, There were so many wonderful passages that came to mind, I had to search them out and make sure I got the details correct. And in doing this I saw in the Bible, what John is speaking about: The constant youthfulness and Abundance of God's love, The certainty of hope and his presence with us always.

So, John told us about his Cursillo weekend and God's presence turning him around:

[Proverbs 3:5-6](#): **Trust** in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

We heard about how God has revealed things in His good time – when He knows we can cope, use it and maybe even understand it better. So, God's timing:

[John 13:7](#): ⁶ He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' ⁷ Jesus replied, 'You do not realise now what I am doing, **but later you will understand.**'
And [John 16:12](#) 'I have **much more** to say to you, **more** than you can now bear.

John spoke about the pureness of God's love and how it takes time for us to begin to grasp it's magnitude. Jesus tried to explain this to the disciples (and like them we are a bit thick at times too) [Luke 11:13](#): If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how **much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!**

[Luke 12:24](#): Consider the ravens: they do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how **much more valuable you are** than birds!

In this talk, John has spoken of the wonderful witness the cursillistas gave when they returned to their parishes after the weekends. It's amazing, but where and when did the sharing back in the churches become difficult? We are not all evangelists, but we can speak of what we know.

[Psalm 66:16](#): Come and hear, all you who fear God; let me tell you what he has done for me.

We heard about difficulties in John's life, but that he holds fast to the Hope we have in Christ.

[Luke 7:50](#): Jesus said to the woman, 'Your faith has saved you; go in peace.'

So, again I thank John for his Witness and inspiration to see more, hope more and accept that we are valuable at every age we attain. It tells me that Cursillo has created a true 'all age' family of worship, discipleship, and confident believers to do what we hear God ask us to do. We are tasked by God through Cursillo to lift and help each other out of the dark places we fall into and bring all who will listen the Hope and Peace of the Love of Our Lord Jesus Christ. AMEN

PILGRIM PARTNERS/SPONSORS (BACC guidance)

Partnering/Sponsorship is a great privilege and joy. It is also a considerable responsibility which requires thought, love and time.

Pilgrim Partners /Sponsors are Cursillistas who:

- want to empower and equip Christians to be effective witnesses for Christ
- have completed a weekend and are active in the fourth day
- are willing to support and encourage their participant at every stage of their journey

Participants are:

- baptised and communicant members of the Anglican and over 18 years of age
- committed Christians seeking renewal and growth in their discipleship

PRAYER is essential as we take on this work of the Holy Spirit. The founders taught "Speak to God of men before speaking to men of God, always loving and respecting the privacy of others". It is also useful to talk with other people who know the person well - especially their parish priest.

The participant should be free of stress and personal problems; ideal circumstances offered as a gift to the participants and the diocesan movement should aim to cover the initial weekend cost.

A participant may only attend Cursillo if their priest or clergy team member, signs the Application Form (or Area Dean in a vacancy).

General Responsibilities of Pilgrim Partners/Sponsors

A. Pre-Cursillo

- Assure participants that they may ask anything about the weekend. Answer truthfully and give them chance to read the information leaflets for themselves. There are no secrets on Cursillo.
- Continue to pray for the participant
- Seek the agreement of their parish priest or clergy team member. Assist, as necessary, with completing the application form.
- If possible, encourage the participant to make their Cursillo in their own Diocese.
- Ensure the participant has everything required for the weekend, including necessary medication etc., that they have details of the venue and the means to get there. Pilgrim Partners/Sponsors can offer to drive them there or make other arrangements as necessary.

B. During the weekend

- Pray continually for the participant and send palanca - remembering that, first and foremost, palanca is prayer.
- Attend "Wake-up", where appropriate.
- It is essential that the Pilgrim Partners/sponsor attends the Closing Service of the weekend to provide the link between the participant and the fourth day community.

C. After the weekend

- Contact the participant soon after the weekend assuring them of your continued prayer and concern. Listen to their experience!
- Consider sending a simple piece of Palanca in the week afterwards.
- Ensure the participant is introduced into a Group Reunion
- Offer to share transport to the first Ultreya after the Cursillo, make sure they are familiar with the format.
- Continue to support the participant.

Partnering/Sponsorship is a very special ministry. Sensitively applied, it is the key to a strong and active 4th Day, which in turn is essential for the healthy development of an active Cursillo Movement.

General Guidance

- It is not advisable to Pilgrim Partners/sponsor a candidate and be on team at the same time. If this is unavoidable a co-sponsor should be chosen.
 - Pilgrim Partners/Sponsors should not sponsor more than two people each weekend.

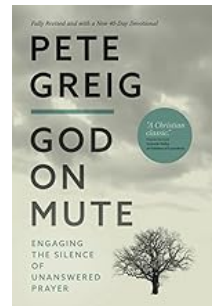
God on Mute **By Pete Greig (Author)**

WHO SHOULD ATTEND A CLW?

The CLW is for all who want to know more about Cursillo. All are welcome, lay or ordained. Those who have any leadership role should certainly attend before, or as soon as possible after taking office.

WHAT IS INCLUDED?

An opportunity for sharing in worship & fellowship, hearing talks on the following and discussing their content with people from other diocesan / provincial movements:

- The Purpose of Cursillo including: Cursillo and the fundamentals of Christian Living
- The Church and the place of the movement
- Forming a Movement including: The Fourth Day First, The Groups – Reunion and Ultreya, Spiritual Direction
- Making the Movement Work including: The Servant Community, The Pre-Cursillo, Authentic Cursillo, The Cursillo Leader
- Looking Ahead
- Taking the information and ideas back to the diocese and sharing them with the leaders there.

DETAILS

CLWs run from 5.30pm on the Friday evening to around 2.00pm on Sunday. The full cost of the weekend is £250 which includes board and room. A £100 per person non-returnable deposit is required on booking. The balance is due one month before the week-end. It is recommended that private holiday insurance is obtained. Please send application forms to the CLW Administrator (see below for contact details).

Bookings should be made via the [booking form](#) no less than 2 months before the weekend and places are allocated on a first come first served basis. (Though last minute places are sometimes available – contact the CLW Administrator to enquire). Application forms can be downloaded from the BACC website.

These two days are a lifting up of the ideals of the Cursillo method. A CLW can be an inspiring and spiritual experience but does not attempt to repeat the Cursillo Weekend experience.

Why not come and share your experience of Cursillo, and learn from others? CLW is an invaluable tool in growing the Cursillo Method.

The AGM 22nd Nov 25

1/ Michelle welcomed everyone and opened with prayer.

2/ The Minutes of the previous annual general meeting were approved.

3/ Finance Report by Irene Milburn.

We end the 2025 year with a balance of £17243.07. This however is £1575.59 less than last year's balance (£18818.66). The main reason for this is that we ran a retreat in 2024 whereby most attendees paid for themselves. This year we ran a successful Cursillo weekend at Launde which was part subsidised by the Southwell & Nottingham group. We have enough in the bank to cover two more weekends including any price increase by Launde.

We do however receive regular giving of approx. £2700 each year plus any gift aid that we can claim. I would like to thank once again all those who do kindly donate regularly to our Cursillo funds. This is either by monthly or quarterly standing orders; without this support we would not be able to run our weekends.

4/ Lay Director's Report by Michelle.

Michelle gave a review of the past year, outlining the monthly Ultreyas and the weekend with 9 pilgrims. The aim to stay in contact with Cursillistas and to grow SNAC wider through new contacts.

Jeff explained the results of the Survey of Cursillistas - only 32 had replied.

Denis suggested we needed to recruit new people, particularly under 40yrs old; but the diocese would not assist us. He thinks the nature of commitment from young people has changed and is different to the traditional view.

Bernard explained his approaches to new parishes in Mansfield. Denis thought we needed to get the vicar on your side - Does the vicar want leaders or workers? We should stress prayer study and action.

We discussed having Ultreyas on Zoom in January and February and one in East Leake after easter. We will send a Doodle Poll to find a date.

5/ Election of officers:

The current officers all agreed to continue, except for Wendy and Helena. Dian agreed to join.
